## Puropose and objectives

- •The working group focuses on examining how the law addresses justice for marginalized and misrepresented groups in the Arctic green transition
- •The objective is to identify deficiencies and weaknesses in the current governance system to ensure a fair green transition for all stakeholders, especially those who are marginalised or misrepresented.
- •Four socio-legal case studies are conducted, examining the impacts of forestry, mining, and wind power on i.e:
  - Rights of Sami indigenous communities
  - Rights of women
  - Rights of foreign communities
  - Rights of nature and/or animals

## Implementation (2025-2028)

- The WP consists of several overlapping projects that will be further defined in the coming years once the rest of the team members are selected
- The team includes WP leader with 2 post doctoral and one PhD researchers (to be recruited from 2025)
- 3 close collaborators
- Focus on case studies from wind energy and mining projects with possible ethnographic work
- Location beyond the Arctic Finnish borders (i.e. Norway Sweden, Democratic Republic of Congo?)
